## LETTER OF INTRODUCTION ASSIGNMENT

Using Google Docs as a delivery system, write a personal letter of introduction and share it with Mr. McCarthy at mc-carthy.j@monet.k12.ca.us. Don't email the letter: Use Google Docs. I will demonstrate how to use Google Docs for this assignment on Tuesday or Wednesday.

With your letter of introduction, follow the format in my example below and please include the following: 1. Introduce yourself. Who are you? What makes you like other teens? What makes you unique from other teens? 2. Tell me about your family: what makes them like other families, what makes them different? 3. Tell me about one experience you valued this summer. 4. Do you have a medical condition that I should know about? If so, describe it. 5. Tell me what you love (more on the subject of love on Tuesday). Lastly title your Google Doc as follows: [Class Period] First Lastname\_Intro Letter. Example: [1] Jim McCarthy\_Intro Letter

DEADLINE: Share your Letter of Introduction as a Google Doc by Friday, Aug 16 @ 11:59pm

Use this salutation. Substitute my name as the addressee.

Notice that, in introducing myself, I note similarities and point to unique things about me. You do this.

Notice that, in discussing my family, I note similarities with other families and point to unique things about mine. You do this.

Here, I discuss one moment from my summer that I valued. Notice that I provide details for the reader. You do this.

Here, I address medical conditions. You do this as well.

My last big paragraph begins with the indication that I'm finishing up: "In closing." Use this phrasing to begin talking about something you love.

Notice how I thank my reader. This form of polite writing is useful. You do it too.

Use the word "Sincerely" before you sign off with your name.
